Edel Copeland's poem paying homage to waves and beaches is apt as I prepare to lead the choir on our long awaited and now eagerly anticipated tour to Cyprus. Postponed twice thanks to Covid and very nearly cancelled altogether as the hotel decided to enter refurbishment, we are now ready.

Preparing for an overseas tour means, at least for the musical director, double the stress!

Aside from the vital preparation in ensuring that the choir are ready to perform to their usual best standard, a foreign tour to a hot country such as Cyprus involves further advance prep.

What, for example, should I wear? One of our concerts will be at an outdoor amphitheatre at 7pm. Fine for the choir – they simply don or doff their jackets, but it's a little trickier for the MD! Careful wardrobe selection is critical...

Then there is the consideration around performing in unfamiliar places where we have had no chance for a sound check. What will the acoustics be like? How might this inform our song performance selection? I'll need to have my antennae tuned!

In Cyprus we will be singing for one of our concerts alongside another choir (the Accord ladies choir, based in Cyprus). How will the vocal dynamics work and will they be able to effectively blend with our choir in the joint numbers? How should we arrange the positions of both choirs to obtain best sound quality and sight lines to me as conductor?

Whilst I will be working through all of these questions with my musical and tech team, choristers will be lying by swimming pools, taking an occasional beer, perhaps wandering off to do some shopping and maybe enjoying some local food. Whilst they do this I can't help but be anxious for them about sun stroke, heat stroke, dehydration, tummy trouble and maybe even getting lost! Truly an MD can never relax.

But after all of this, I know that they are CMVC. It really will all be OK!?

THE CMVC STAGE MANAGER


Have you ever tried herding cats, knitting fog or persuading an excited group of 70 choristers to line up in a particular way? Ray Pascoe is a master of the first two elements – that's the qualification for trying to do the third!

Being CMVC's Stage Manager is a huge and difficult responsibility. He must liaise across the choir to know who will be attending a concert and where the MD would like each to stand. He must then devise a system for getting everyone on and off stage efficiently (and safely), whilst retaining his good humour and patience.

Its an unsung hero kind of a job. Nobody ever says at the end of a concert "gosh the stage manager was good". It is an unseen but critically important role for which lots of people have ideas, but few have the ability to put them into practice.

Thank you then to Ray Pascoe, who will be doing his thing every time we perform – but you as an audience are very unlikely (hopefully!) to notice!
